How did the Black Death prove a catalyst for Social and Economic change?

Using the background of the Silk Roads, an understanding is gained of the causes of the spread of the Black Death, the impacts it had on quality of life in the Middle Ages.

Potential cures are evaluated.

HNC1

An enquiry looking at the problems faced by Medieval Monarchs. Starting with identifying who the Medieval monarchs were and their fates. The importance of Medieval queens and an analysis of how powerful these monarchs were.

Summer Term The Problem of Medieval Monarchs

Starting with the retreat of the Romans, students learn about Anglo-Saxon society pre 1066. They study how Britain is fragmented through repeated conflict until William of Normandy unites the country in 1066. Finally, how William maintains peace and order. HNC 7,1

The origins of conflict in the Middle East (Holy Lands) and the First Crusade. Locating key places involved. Why did the Christians suffer when they reached the Holy Land, Saladin and the remaining Crusades. HNC1,7


